B. Admission Requirements for Senior College Program

Minimum GPA: 2.0

To take advantage of this articulation agreement, students must complete the A.A. in Liberal Arts and Sciences with a Concentration in Communication Studies at Queensborough Community College and be accepted as a transfer student at Brooklyn College. Upon transfer, students must declare a major in Communication Sciences and Disorders at Brooklyn College.

Total transfer credits granted toward the baccalaureate degree: <u>60 credits</u>. Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: <u>60 credits</u>.

*BC will accept a minimum of 60 credits for all courses taken for credit at an undergraduate CUNY_college with a passing grade of D- or higher, regardless of whether a specific equivalency exists. For courses that do not have an equivalent, elective credits will be granted.

Courses in the areas of statistics (Psychology 3400 or its equivalent), physical sciences (Physics 1005/1100, Chemistry 1007 or an equivalent), and social/behavioral sciences (Psychology 1000 or its equivalent) are strongly suggested. Students must maintain a "B" average in major courses, with no grade lower than a C. No course may be repeated more than

2. once.

F. Articulation Agreement Follow-Up Procedures

Procedures for reviewing, up-dating, modifying or terminating agreement:

This agreement will be valid for 3 academic years from the Effective Date (below). Each year, there will be a review of the agreement's effectiveness by the Academic Affairs Officers at each institution.

When any of the programs within this agreement undergo any changes relevant to this agreement, this agreement will be reviewed and revised as necessary by the sending and receiving programs.

Either party may independently cancel this agreement by notifying the other party no less than one academic year before the intended date of cancellation.

Procedures for evaluating agreement:

The Offices of Institutional Effectiveness from each campus will keep data on the academic progress of the transfer students. Upon request, Brooklyn College will provide Queensborough Community College with names and academic status of all recent transfer students from QCC pursuing the abovementioned bachelor's degree program.

Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement:

Queensborough Community College and Brooklyn College will collaborate in publicizing this agreement on their websites and in their catalogs. They will share brochures and other marketing materials including web-based promotions. Transfer advisors will be made aware of this agreement and will have available all necessary materials to publicize the agreement to the students with whom they work.

Brooklyn College faculty, staff, and administration are encouraged to visit QCC for recruitment events. They will be assisted by the Office of Academic Affairs and the Transfer Resource Center at Queensborough Community College.
