



ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

A. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

Sending College: Fiorello H. LaGuardia Community College
Department: Liberal Arts
Program: Liberal Arts Social Science and Humanities: Journalism Option
Degree: Associate of Arts

Receiving College: Brooklyn College
Department: Television, Film & Emerging Media
Program: Journalism and Media Studies
Degree: Bachelor of Science

LaGuardia Community College and Brooklyn College hereby enter into this agreement to facilitate the transfer of students from LaGuardia Community College's Journalism Option in the Liberal Arts Social Science and Humanities Associate of Arts Degree (A.A.) to Brooklyn College's Bachelor of Science Degree in Journalism and Media Studies.

Section B of this agreement specifies the requirements for admission to Brooklyn College's Journalism and Media Studies B.S. program. Section C details the course-to-course equivalencies and Transfer Credit awarded and Sections D-E detail the courses and number of credits students must take at Brooklyn College to receive the B.S. in Journalism and Media Studies.

Brooklyn College agrees to accept into the Bachelor of Science degree program in Journalism and Media Studies students from LaGuardia Community College who successfully complete the degree requirements of the Journalism Option in the Liberal Arts as described in sections B-C of this agreement and who successfully complete and receive an Associate of Arts Degree.

B. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

- Cumulative GPA of 2.0 on a 4.0 scale.
- Grade of B or higher in ENG102 Writing Through Literature (equivalent to ENGL1012 at Brooklyn College.)
- Grade of C or higher in any major course in order for it to be applied to the major at Brooklyn College.
- Brooklyn College will accept courses as transfer credit only, not course grades.
- Students eligible for transfer to Brooklyn College under this agreement must have met at least the minimum requirements for admission to LAGCC, including a US high school diploma or its equivalent.

- Students are guaranteed 60 credits, but may transfer more into Brooklyn College. Students must earn a minimum of 120 credits to receive the bachelor's degree with at least 30 credits taken in residence at Brooklyn College.

F. ARTICULATION AGREEMENT FOLLOW UP PROCEDURES

Procedures for reviewing, updating, modifying or terminating the agreement:

- Review: At the end of each academic year, the various representatives of each institution will review the performance of transfer students to determine if adjustment or termination of the articulation agreement is warranted.
- Changes: Neither party may change the agreement unilaterally. Proposed changes in policies and/or curricula (i.e. admission and degree requirements, course numbers, content and/or catalog descriptions) must be communicated in writing to the other party, and jointly agreed upon in consultation with the relevant officials of each institution. Mutually agreed upon changes must be chronicled in writing and that document signed, dated, and attached to this original agreement.
- Cancellation: Either party may independently cancel this agreement by notifying the other party no less than one academic year before the intended date of cancellation.

G. ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- This articulation agreement will be publicized on both the LAGCC and BC websites. Transfer advisors at LAGCC will promote this agreement with eligible students.
- Both institutions agree to monitor the academic performance of LAGCC students who wish to matriculate at Brooklyn College under this agreement, identify problems, and work cooperatively to ensure smooth transfer with minimal academic disruption.
- LaGuardia Community College students who plan to transfer into the Bachelor of Science degree in Journalism and Media Studies program at Brooklyn College are advised to strictly follow the Program Requirements and Program Electives listed in this proposal to satisfy the requirements of for the Journalism Option in the Liberal Arts Associates of Arts degree at LAGCC and to ensure that the maximum number of credits and required coursework are transferred to satisfy the Journalism and Media Studies program requirements at Brooklyn College.
