As of the most recent available data (**November 03, 2022**), **1.8% more** undergraduates have enrolled for the 2023 January Intersession than were enrolled in the 2022 January Intersession at this time last year. They are taking **5.6% more** credits than they were at this time last year. There are **76.2% fewer** undergraduates enrolled for the 2023 January Intersession than the final enrollment count for the 2022 January Intersession, and this constitutes **74.1% fewer** credits.

As of the most recent available data (November 03, 2022), 134.5% more graduate students have enrolled for the 2023 January Intersession than were enrolled in the 2022 January Intersession at this time last year. They are taking 89.5% more credits than they were at this time last year. There are 84.9% fewer graduate students enrolled for the 2023 January Intersession than the final enrollment count for the 2022 January Intersession, and this constitutes 84.6% fewer credits.
