As of the most recent available data (**January 16, 2025**), **4.1% fewer** undergraduates have enrolled for the 2025 January Intersession than were enrolled in the 2024 January Intersession at this time last year. They are taking **6.7% fewer** credits than they were at this time last year. There are **5.2% fewer** undergraduates enrolled for the 2025 January Intersession than the final enrollment count for the 2024 January Intersession, and this constitutes **6.6% fewer** credits.

As of the most recent available data (**January 16, 2025**), **29.0% more** graduate students have enrolled for the 2025 January Intersession than were enrolled in the 2024 January Intersession at this time last year. They are taking **27.2% more** credits than they were at this time last year. There are **26.9% more** graduate students enrolled for the 2025 January Intersession than the final enrollment count for the 2024 January Intersession, and this constitutes **26.5% more** credits.
