

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

I. SENDING AND RECEIVING INSTITUTIONS

Sending College: Fiorello H. LaGuardia Community College
Department: Education and Language Acquisition Department
Program: Spanish-English Translation
Degree: Associate in Arts

Receiving College: Brooklyn College
Department: Department of Modern Languages and Literatures
Program: Spanish
Degree: Bachelor of Arts

LaGuardia Community College-CUNY (hereafter referred to as LAGCC), a community college in Long Island City, Queens, New York and Brooklyn College-CUNY (hereafter referred to as Brooklyn), an institution in New York, New York agree to articulate the option outlined in this document to ensure a smooth transfer process for LaGuardia Community College graduates.

The purpose of this Articulation Agreement (the "Agreement") is to establish collaboration between LaGuardia Community College and Brooklyn College, to promote degree completion and facilitate the transfer process. This Agreement provides assurance that students will matriculate into Brooklyn College with junior standing. The following general principles guide the operation of this agreement.

II. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS FOR SENIOR COLLEGE PROGRAM

Applicants successfully completing an associate degree in Spanish-English Translation at LAGCC will be guaranteed transfer admission into the bachelor's degree program in Spanish at Brooklyn College and will transfer with junior standing at Brooklyn College based on the following conditions:

- overall GPA or higher based on Brooklyn's current admission criteria and A.S./A.A./A.A.S. graduation requirements (2.0 as of Fall 2019)
- Grade of C or better in all Spanish courses (i.e., ELS200, ELS204, ELS209, and ELS210)

Total transfer credits toward the baccalaureate degree: 60

Total additional credits required at the senior college to complete baccalaureate degree: 60

Please Note: Students are guaranteed 60 credits, but may transfer more into Brooklyn College. Students must earn a minimum of 120 credits, with at least 30 of those credits taken at Brooklyn College.

If all credits do not count for requirements in the major, they will then count as elective credit toward the degree or credit toward a minor or another major (based on degree requirements in other programs at Brooklyn College). All courses will be reviewed according to the expectations and parameters laid out by the Middle States Commission on Higher Education's *Characteristics of Excellence in Higher Education: Requirements of Affiliation and Standards for Accreditation*.

V. PROMOTION/OUTREACH

LAGCC and Brooklyn College agree to publicize this Agreement via, but not limited to, printed and electronic marketing materials and communications. LAGCC and Brooklyn College agree to collaborate to ensure successful transfer.

VI. TERM/MONITOR/REVIEW

1. The initial term of this agreement shall be three years from the date of the last signature, with three (3) automatic renewals of two years each to follow.
2. The agreement may be amended or renewed by mutual agreement and will be formalized via revision to this agreement.
3. Brooklyn College will provide LAGCC with statistics regarding transfer students from LAGCC, including admissions data (applications, acceptances, enrollments, median institutional aid awarded, median acceptance and enrollment GPA), and aggregate performance data (Brooklyn College GPA, completion rates, time to completion).
4. LAGCC and Brooklyn College agree to communicate program changes in a timely manner to avoid disruption of student progress toward degree completion.
5. The primary points of contact for this agreement are listed below. In the event of any changes, the institution changing will notify the partner institution's contact as soon as a new contact has been named and in a timely fashion.


