Procedures for evaluating agreement, e.g., tracking the number of students who transfer under the articulation agreement and their success: This success of this agreement will be evaluated by tracking the number of students who transfer from La Guardia to Brooklyn College. Moreover, both parties will review every three years students transfer, attrition, and graduation rates.

Sending and receiving college procedures for publicizing agreement, e.g., college catalogs, transfer advisers, Websites: The communications studies program will be publicized in the college catalog, on the Humanities Department website, plasma television screens around the campus, flyers distributed by the admission office recruitment team to the external community, and emails to students.
